October Meeting Minutes

Burnet County Republican Women PAC Minutes of General Meeting – October 7, 2021 Sylvester H. Reed Memorial Building – Burnet, Texas

Welcome, Call to Order, and Opening Ceremonies: President Mary Jane Avery welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 11:30 a.m., and a lunch was served. Chaplain Sue Boss Lee gave the invocation, and Burnet County Clerk Janet Parker led the pledges to the American and Texas flags.

Introductions: President Mary Jane introduced local elected officials, precinct

chairs, new members, and guests. Candidates introduced themselves. **Approval of Minutes:** The September minutes were published in the newsletter. There were no corrections. They stand approved as published. members and 17 associates for 2021, and one new member joined today.

Membership Report: Membership Chair Janice Estill reported that we have 155

Campaign Activities: Campaign Activities Chair Mary Jane explained that BCRW does not endorse candidates during the primaries. Mary Jane thanked Kara for her role in getting the regeneron treatments in Burnet County.

Sue Boss Lee will be responsible for our caring and kindness cards and memorials/honorariums. Contact Sue if you know of a need.

Program: Our speaker, Cat Parks, Republican Party of Texas Vice Chair, was unable to attend. In lieu of a program, Kara Chasteen and Sheriff Calvin Boyd gave reports and answered questions. Kara discussed the ongoing search for a GOP headquarters and her need for an office to meet with candidates. She gave a report on redistricting and stated that the maps would be voted on in the legislature on the following Tuesday. Ellen Troxclair is running for district 19 representative, which is our new district. Terry Wilson will run for district 20 representative which is in Williamson County. We will lose U.S. Representative Roger Williams, and our new representative will be John Carter. Tom Maynard will remain our State Board of Education Representative. November 13 is the deadline for filing in county races and December 2 for precinct chairs. There are several contested positions, and Kara promised to be unbiased. When maps are finalized, Mary Jane will put them in the newsletter.

Sheriff Boyd gave a report on the situation at the border followed by questions and answers.

Announcements:

- Precinct chair meeting October 23, 10-12:00, location to be announced.
- Londa Chandler, Burnet County Republican Club President, reported that the border patrol agents cannot receive gifts. She asked the agent who spoke at the BCRC meeting recently, and he said they needed meals. Her idea was to do shoebox cookies. Mary Jane suggested that be the Caring for America project for December. We will hear more about it in the newsletter.
- TFRW Convention Mary Jane asked that attendees stand and be recognized.
- Wine Wednesday is October 27 at Enoteca.

The door prize was a gift card from Darci's Deli, and the winner was Lola Crawford.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:00.







Map of our new Senate District
